## Funds raised for delivery of Activity Packs for members

Our 'Friendship Phone Call' scheme continues to thrive, with more members being matched with a volunteer every week. The scheme involves a volunteer contacting one of our members on a weekly basis for a friendly chat and also to make sure they are ok and have everything they need, for example shopping and medicine. #### **Trace and Test**

The Government has announced test and trace arrangements. The key points are:

- Anyone with symptoms will be tested and their close contacts will be traced
- New guidance means those who have been in close contact with someone
  who tests positive must isolate for 14 days, even if they have no symptoms,
  to avoid unknowingly spreading the virus.

Royal Mencap are working through what announcement could also mean for us all and we will provide further guidance once these have been assessed.
